
October 20 Showcase Lea Coryell

Lea Coryell has graduate degrees in American History and Library Science, and in his work at the Library of Congress he catalogues legal materials going back to the Salem witch trials and earlier. His passion for history shows up on stage, with an eclectic mix of American and British traditional songs, sea chanteys, and old time music, and an occasional contemporary song as well.

Growing up in Chagrin Falls, Ohio, Lea's first instrument was the harmonica, and he listened to blues by Sonny Terry & Brownie McGhee, Little Walter, and Sonny Boy Williamson. He learned guitar to accompany his harp playing, and later concentrated on the banjo, perfecting the clawhammer style. He still plays all three instruments, but is most often seen with a banjo, and he cites Sheila Adams, Bob Carlin, Bob Flesher, Tommy Jarrell, Wade Ward, and Kyle Creed as his strongest influences.




Lea will perform solo for the showcase, but he also collaborates with others. He sometimes performs with Appalachian dulcimer player Ralph Lee Smith, usually for historical events. He and Joan Kennedy appear both as a duet and, with Dennis and Martha Doyle, as the group Red Leaf. Red Leaf has been hosting another venue, the Potomac Overlook Coffeehouse, for five years now. It's at the Nature Center on Marcy Road in Arlington, on the third Saturday of the month through April. The guest artist on October 17 is the Folk Club's own Ray Kaminsky, and on November 14 it will be Joe Hickerson.

A member of the Folk Club since it's third meeting back in 1985, Lea has performed at the club many times. But he has a special talent that hasn't been seen in quite a while - juggling! If we're lucky, or perhaps if we provide a little encouragement, Lea will do a demonstration. Don't miss his showcase!

Mike Seeger's fidelity to traditional sounds has set him apart from other performers since he began touring the United States and abroad in 1960. His music conveys all the depth of feeling, the sheer energy, and the infinite variety and texture of true traditional rural music. As he sings the old songs, he plays in a wide traditional of accompanying himself on an array of instruments including banjo, fiddle, guitar, jaw harp, harmonica, quills, lap dulcimer, mandolin and autoharp. From a legendary folk family, the Seeger's sang together Saturday nights. Mike began playing instruments in his late teens, learning first from nearby musicians such as his close friend Elizabeth Cotton, then later with Maybelle Carter, Dock Boggs, Cousin Emmy and Kirby Snow. Mike's love for music led him to produce more than twenty field five records and video documentaries.

Mike was a founding member of the *New Lost City Ramblers*, and has recorded over forty albums solo and with others. Mike has been honored with three Grammy award nominations.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase all you have to do is:

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- practice, practice, practice!
