May 11 Showcase – Deirdre Murphy

Deirdre Murphy and her husband Lou Ruffino have some new excitement around their house. They live out in the woods in Potomac with groundhogs, foxes, raccoons, and herds of deer (LOTS of deer...). But it's Lou's new grand-daughter, born on February 3, who has done the most to rekindle a sense of wonder and an appreciation of nature there. His grandson, now three and a half, has

developed a love for the guitar, which they've been encouraging. All the activity at home, and her job editing medical literature in Bethesda, keep Deirdre busy, but she always makes time for music.

If you haven't heard Deirdre's voice before, you're in for a treat. Her lovely soprano has graced everything from operatic arias and the theater to jazz and folk classics. She grew up the youngest of four singing siblings in

a very musical family, and could play the Hungarian Rhapsody on the piano at age six. She had seven years of classical voice lessons, and took college courses in music theory and counterpoint. Peter, Paul, and Mary and Judy Collins are her biggest influences in the folk world, and she loves the voices of Anne Hills and Priscilla Herdman, who have performed at the Folk Club.

Deirdre has been leaning more toward jazz lately, and listens to pianists and horn players as well as vocalists. For her showcase, she'll be concentrating on old jazz and swing standards, mostly love songs from the 20's and 30's, by Irving Berlin and others. **Mike Ball**, whose fluid fingerstyle technique matches the material perfectly, will accompany Deirdre on guitar. Jack Williams is a national class guitarist, singer and song/writer. Among acoustic guitarists he is nearlegendary. Having avoided the compromises of the commercial music industry during his 40 year professional career, he has preferred working on the road, playing coffeehouses, concerts and festivals week in and week out, from the sheer love and respect for the music. Jack has been writing since 1970, and has a new CD of original music, Across the Winterline, on the new Wind River label which a subsidiary of Folk Era. Jack also has Dreams of the Song Dog on Nashville's Winter Harvest Records, and Highway from Back Home, his 1993 independent CD. In 1980. Tom Jones recorded one of Jack's songs as a single and an album cut. Jack worked with Harry Nilsson on an album effort in 1973, and co-produced Mickey Newbury's newest CD, Lulled by the Moonlight.

As a singer/songwriter, Jack has performed with artists such as Dave Mason, Dar Williams, Tom Paxton, David Wilcox, John Gorka, Johnathan Edwards and Leon Russell. As a hired-gun guitarist, Jack has worked shows with John Lee Hooker, Big Joe Turner, Jerry Butler, and Hank Ballard, and opened performances for the Allman Brothers, Delbert McClinton and Arthur Conley, and backed up

performances by the Shirelles, Brooklyn Bridge, the Coasters, the Drifters and the Platters.

Jack draws his songwriting and inspiration from artists such as Jesse Winchester, Bob Dylan, Hank Williams, Willis Alan Ramsey and Ray Charles. A quote from Glenn Drinkwater of the 12 Corners Coffeehouse raves, "I am still somewhat in amazement about what I saw ... the way peoples' heads kept snapping around to look at each other in astonishment."

When BananaRama and the Fun Boy Three failed to show at the Tortilla Factory last month, the Lunatics did indeed take over the asylum. The Porch Monkeys had to finish their set behind an invisible force field of spirit skull-bones for protection from flying bananas and bean burritos. The technical difficulties associated with wires and mic's left the clustered pluckers delirious and the full house furious. Apparently, their previous performances at Patio Daddy-O's in Mud Puddle Gulch always ended the same way or hilariously worse. But this

time, however, the sub-harmonic resonance (18Hz) of bugged-out, bulging eye-

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase all you have to do is:

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- practice, practice, practice!
