February 13 Showcase – The Sterling Trio

The Sterling Trio (Joanie Clark, Thione Shenk, and Kristi Mason Cudd) is a relatively new group that made their debut at the Folk Club last year. Since then, they've been playing at church functions, libraries, and the 4H Fair, developing a repertoire of songs with strong vocal harmonies. The Trio performs songs by the Judds, Tanya Tucker, Carla Bonoff, and the Dolly Parton/Emmy Lou Harris/Linda Ronstadt collaboration, among others. Their guitars will be complemented by a guest musician, Frank Johnson, on mandolin.

All of the trio members have long music careers. Thione also performs with the country band Sweet Dixie in Manassas, and Kristi is a member of Popp Culture, which plays weddings and special functions. Joanie, Kristi, and Frank were, until recently, in a bluegrass and gospel band called Working On A Building, named after a Bill Monroe song.


Joanie, who is the Folk Club member in the group, is a CPA who owns an accounting and tax preparation company that keeps her very busy at this time of year. Musically, she has played almost everything imaginable, from top 40 rock through folk to bluegrass. Originally from the Navy town of Norfolk (her father was the captain of the USS Yorktown when it pulled Apollo 8 out of the ocean), Joanie went on the road as a teenager with a women's rock quartet called Pink Champagne. With Joanie on lead guitar and vocals, they toured from Virginia south through Georgia, plus Puerto Rico and Cuba. Other groups followed over the years, and Joanie also worked with Bill McGinnis, who has played with John Jackson. As a singer, she's been most influenced by Judy Collins, Claire Lynch, and Carla Bonoff.



Three cooks aren't too many for the kitchen when it comes to **Hot Soup**, the Baltimore-Washington-based "family folk" trio comprised of **Christina Muir**, **Sue Trainor** and **Jennifer Agner**. **Soup Happens** is the "second serving," following their self-titled debut, and comes forth with impeccable harmonies, clever lyrical parodies, diverse instrumental accompaniment, and an uncanny knack for blending traditional and contemporary folk flavors with inventive vocal arrangements. Their audience-engaging performances and charming musical variety make them a must-see live act. Each Soupster brings a unique chunk of solo talent to the mix.

Sue Trainor's well-honed comic bent finds its form both in clever parody songs and children's music, but her warm alto can just as easily embrace a poignant ballad or a topical folk tune. Trainor's solo album *In a Closeup* was nominated as Album of the Year, Best Debut Album and Best Contemporary Folk Album in the Wammies, and she has been nominated numerous times for Best Female Vocalist in the Children's Music Category, an award she won in 1996 and 1997. Sue also works in schools as an Artist-In-Education.

Christina Muir, the daughter of popular folk singer Ann Mayo Muir, wears her genes well and sings with a natural elegance. Her voice radiates with the lithe grace of an open spirit seeking love's renewal on "New Day", while her guitar and dulcimer sweetly support the trio's harmonies throughout the album. Muir has ventured into children's music, releasing *Over, Under, Around & Through* with Eric Garrison, and on the adult side, Mike Joyce of the Washington Post described Muir's solo debut *Feet First* as having irresistible charm and honesty.

Jennifer Agner, Hot Soup's newest addition and also a member of the folk, blues and swing band The Dilettantes (with her huband, Eric - they have a new album, *This Small Town*), brings a soaring soprano along with talents on rhythm guitar, banjo and accordian.

On most Tuesday evenings, the Folk Club is an open mike format with a sign-up board. Each performer has 12 minutes, including setup time. This allows three songs if you set up FAST and the songs are of moderate length.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase you must:

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
- prepare to be featured in the next newsletter!
