March 13 Showcase – Wyn Walke

yn Walke (pronounced 'walk' – the e is silent) got his first guitar after seeing the Beatles on the Ed Sullivan show, and their version of 'Twist and Shout' was the first song he ever learned. He played in bands during Junior and Senior High School in his native Aiken, South Carolina, covering the Beatles plus some surf, soul, and psychedelic music. At the University of South Carolina, though, Wyn got switched to slide, which has been his primary focus ever since.

It was Crosby, Stills, and Nash's 'Teach Your Children' that did it – with Jerry Garcia on pedal steel guitar. Wyn got hooked, and became a pedal steel player in country rock bands, doing Poco, New Riders of the Purple Sage, and Eagles tunes. He also played with an electric bluegrass band named Sour Mash.

Wyn moved to this area in 1977 to pursue day job opportunities (he does computer software

consulting). He kept playing pedal steel until 1983, when he switched to acoustic slide and lap steel. It was Ry Cooder and David Lindley's work that drew him this time, and 1920's Weissenborn guitars (beautiful Koa lap guitars with a hollow neck). He has also recently become enamored with Dobro styles (he points to Jerry Douglas of Allison Kraus' band as the inspiration). He currently appears with two groups: **LoDown** is an electric R&B, blues, reggae, and New Orleans band, with Wyn on regular electric guitar and lap steel. **Slide of Hand** features Wyn on Weissenborn with a bassist and percussionist.

For his showcase, Wyn will play both Weissenborn and Dobro, and will be accompanied by Slide of Hand's bassist, **Brad Dietz**. He says we can expect obscure covers, songs that we probably haven't heard before. Don't miss this showcase!

Tim Harrison composes his music using a unique blend of traditional and contemporary folk with a country base and a pervasive essence of spirtual/Celtic moods. Revered in his home Canada, Tim has released five albums since 1979, including Train Going East (produced by Stan Rogers), In the Barroom Light on Fogarty's Cove label, and The Stars Above, Bridges and Tim Harrison - his latest recording of three on the 2nd Ave label. Tim has been described as a "wizard with words, wringing poetry from our everyday struggles and making those subtle shifts in imagery that make a great songwriter. He has the all-too-rare ability to reach inside and body forth lyrics that are from the heart and real. The true heritage of folk music - alive not archival." What is remarkable as well is Tim's ability to evoke the essence and mood of his lyrics as much through his beautifully wrought arrangements as through his verse. Tim is known for rendering a dynamic and powerful performance that never fails to delight. His wit, rapport with audiences, and storytelling are legendary. He is one of those rare artists whose talents in the studio translate to the stage and vice versa, creating an inspiring and magical presence in both musical forums.

Tim has played everywhere from the **Philadelphia Folk Festival** to Toronto's Harbourfront Centre for the Performing Arts, the Stan Rogers Folk Festival to New York's Speakeasy, and from England's Midland Arts Centre to Scotland's An Lanntair Arts Centre.

Tim was the **founding artistic director** of the Summerfolk Music and Crafts festival in Owen Sound, the artistic director of the All-Canadian Mariposa Festival, Northwinds folk festival and the Eaglewood Folk Festival. Tim was recognized with the **Porcupine Award** for his work in building and sustaining folk music in Canada.

Eleni Kelakos is a Los Angeles based contemporary folk singer and songwriter. Her debut CD, I Will Fly, garnered a place on FOLK-DJ List's Best New CD's of 1998 and Richard Gillman's list of Most Aired CD's of 1998. Her album promotion tour covered the west coast, centering on California colleges and a finalist at the Napa Valley Festival Emerging Songwriter Showcase. A self-described "Embassy Brat", Eleni spent the first fifteen years of her life living and traveling throughout Europe and the middle east, developing keen powers of observation and an appreciation for the diversity and similarity of people the world over. Believing in the power of the song and spoken word, Eleni tells stories full of the rich details of human experience, with an unblinking truth and an emphasis on hope and personal transformation. She sings in a voice described by Music Reviews Quarterly as having "shocking clarity, unlike any female singer since Joan Baez." Eleni's "Nickels and Dimes" was featured on MRQ's Summer '99 compilation CD. Eleni has been featured in many premier folk clubs and coffeehouses in L.A. such as The Crooked Bar and Highland Grounds, and on radio programs for KPFK and KPBS. She's a member of INDIEGRRL, and an active participant and occasional guest host of L.A. songwriting forums, Women And Their Power Tools, contributing a song on their compilation CD.

Eleni is on a nationwide tour for her CD To The Bone.

On most Tuesday evenings, the Folk Club is an open mike format with a sign-up board. Each performer has 12 minutes, including setup time. This allows three songs if you set up FAST and the songs are of moderate length.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase you must:

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
- prepare to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified advertisements, articles, reviews, artwork and other music related items to Irene Boyer at irene@caboyer.com. All items must be emailed in MSWord, WordPerfect, or ASCII text format. Information must be received one week before the first day of the month in which you want it published.
