January 12 - Laura Schier Showcase

Laura Schier sings – she was in the Herndon Chorale and Show Choir. She dances – fifteen years of lessons have included tap, ballet, jazz, lyrical, and Irish. She acts – theater gigs include *Crazy For You*, *Damn Yankees*, *Fiddler on the Roof*, and *Anything Goes*. She's learning guitar. She has a degree in Human Services from Virginia Tech, and is planning graduate school and a career in Arts Management. She's a well-adjusted, productive member of society.

Any one of these accomplishments would be considered remarkable under the circumstances, but the fact that she's accomplished all of them constitutes a minor miracle!

The difficulties Laura faced in early childhood are well known to most club members – her mother, of course, is **Sue Schier** of the **Zen Gospel Trio**. Their history, particularly their formation at the Illinois Correctional Facility for Wayward Girls, had a profound impact on Laura's youth. Her Mom was in for "entrepreneurship and serial delinquency," and her father **Jim** was an engineer refurbishing the Facility's plumbing infrastructure (OK, he was really removing the toilet seats, so the inmates couldn't hit themselves over the head and drown). It was in this capacity that Jim had a brief encounter with Sue in the handicapped stall. Indeed, this same stall is where Laura was later delivered, with the other Zen Gospels, **Diane Lafleur** and **Kathleen Abbott**, adding "practicing midwifery without a license" to the long list of their crimes.

To keep her out of foster care, Laura was smuggled out of the Facility in an empty guitar case by



an old friend of Sue's, a musician, back-up singer, and fake-ID artist from California named Kitty. Thus began Laura's itinerant childhood, more at Kitty's home in Torrance than anywhere else, but mostly on the road with a wide range of roots musicians. Six years later, Kitty was playing Dobro on tour with Pete Seeger & Arlo Guthrie when Sue's debt to society was finally repaid. Still blinking because she hadn't seen the sun in so long, Sue caught up to them at Wolf Trap, was reunited with Laura, and rekindled the "stalled" relationship with Jim. They settled down to what passes for a normal life here in suburban Virginia, and Laura has blossomed as her roots could finally take hold.

Laura didn't survive this childhood completely unscathed, of course. She has a recurring amphibian affinity, for example, and currently has about 25 frogs at home. This has nothing to do with kissing them, or an early Kermit fixation, or whatever else you're thinking right now, it's just the way things are. Considering her formative years, a little eccentricity is to be expected, and if frogs are the nepenthe to assuage the mental borborygmus of her youth, so be it!

For her showcase, Laura will be joined by a stellar band, including **Harry, Fang, Mark Casale, Tom Shabala**, her Mom, and perhaps the other Zen Gospels. She'll be crooning and wailing songs from Donovan, Patience & Prudence, Bonnie Raitt, and Patsy Cline. Gonna be way cool, folks, don't miss the totally awesome radical dudette's showcase!

Take a little bit of Gladys Knight, and a drop of Mavis Staples, throw in some James Taylor, a little Emily Saliers and a pinch of Jackson Brown, and you'll come out with the acoustic soul fusion of **Verlette Simon**.

Born and raised in Brooklyn, New York Verlette Simon has been a part of the music industry for almost two decades. She began her career touring with a church choir, performing in musical theater troops, and writing pop songs for her seventh grade choral group. At 17 she was songwriter and vocal director for the popular musical "I'm Growing As Fast As I Can". She attended both Brooklyn College of the Performing Arts and Lehman Performing Arts College, and has studied with a variety of voice teachers. Former lead singer and songwriter for Columbia Records band Buddah, Verlette has recorded with major label artists like Fine Young Cannibals, and Moby Love. Verlette has worked in both the A&R and Promotion departments of Atlantic Records. She has shared the stage with Castleberry Dupre, Milo Z, Rachel Cross, and Patty Labelle, Salt 'N Pepper, and Toshi Regan just to name a few. Her performances are full of inspirational anecdotes, introspective moments and an outpouring of soulful energy. She has performed at Venues such as, The Kennedy Center, The Washington Club, Kensington Coffee House, Metro Café, Jammin Java, Berwyn Café, Woodstock at Chief Ike's Mambo Room, Madame's Organ, and a variety house concerts and folk festivals. **Verlette** is currently releasing a new cd, "Elements" with former partner Michael Willis on Twisted Folk records, and her most requested song "Sorry" was chosen by the Woody Guthrie foundation to be included in their 2002 compilation cd. Verlette is the founder and director of Ubervox, a women's music networking, education organization and concert series based in the Washington DC area.

Whether on a festival stage, or in a quiet listening room, **David A. Alberding** creates an intimate setting. Using a dynamic, percussive guitar style, along with a rich, distinctive baritone, this Maryland native sets the stage for his cast of characters. Blending together elements of folk, rock, jazz and blues, David creates characters with his words and his voice that share an insight into the human condition. This style and uniqueness have yielded recognition for David as a major contributor to the Washington area music scene, including 2 consecutive nominations for Best Male Vocalist in Contemporary Folk by the Washington Area Music Association, and two awards in the Mid Atlantic Song Contest sponsored by the Songwriters Association of Washington for his songs "**Heavy**" and "**Circle of Three**", and 1999 runner up in the John Lennon Songwriting contest for "**The Waiting Room**". David donates his talent every summer to the Carol Jean Cancer Foundation, providing music for the families of children with cancer at their Camp Friendship campfires. His composition "**Friendship**" is the adopted theme song of Camp Friendship.
