## September 13 Showcase – Michelle Murray

Michelle Murray has been playing the guitar and composing songs for over twenty years. Originally from New Jersey, she came to the University of Maryland for a journalism degree. Back home again, she performed at many venues in the NY/NJ Metropolitan area, helped found and hosted the Hilltop Coffeehouse in Englewood, and had a folk radio show, "Open Stage," on WFDU-FM in Teaneck. Her show featured interviews with performers like Dave Van Ronk, Rod McDonald, Rory Block, and David Massengill.

A job as a radio traffic reporter lured Michelle back to our area. After reporting for WTOP and WMAL, she moved on to jobs producing and editing for other groups and publications, and currently works on web content for University of Maryland Medicine. She lives across the river with her husband and two cats, but occasionally manages the trek out our way.

In the DC area, Michelle has played the Austin Grill, Kensington Coffeehouse, Jammin' Java, College Perk, Mayorga Coffee Factory, Riverdale Bookshop, Berwyn Café, Mountain Stage New Song Festival, Fete De La Musique, and Artomatic Arts Festival, and has been a guest on Damien Einstein's show on WRNR-FM. As a member of the Keshet Chorale, she sang at the Kennedy Center's Millenium Stage, and her song *Married Women* is a current Editor's Pick on the Washington Post MP3 website (<http://mp3.washingtonpost.com/picks>).

You can hear Michelle regularly at the New Deal Café Songwriter's Round on the third Wednesday of each month, and she hosts an open mike for the Songwriter's Association of Washington (SAW) on the first and third Fridays at Caribou Coffee in Olney, MD. She's a board member and webmaster for SAW, as well.

Michelle and Anne Sucher, who perform together as "Water's Edge," have a new CD called *Make a Choice*, and Michelle has a 4-song solo sampler, *This Life*. She's also in a trio, "Only Restin," with Les Hatley and Greg Vickers.

For her showcase, Michelle will be joined by **Greg Vickers**, **Ron Goad**, **Les Hatley**, and **Dan Grove**, with a possible stealth cameo from **TM Hanna**. She'll be doing original songs that combine folk and country, with a touch of the blues and a contagious twinkle in her eye. Don't miss it!

# Vassar Clements 1928-2005



On August 16, 2005 Vassar Clements passed away at his daughter's home near Nashville, Tennessee after a battle with lung cancer.

Having started playing with Bill Monroe at the tender age of 14, he went on to become one of the best and most well-known fiddle players in American history. Equally at home in the bluegrass, country, pop, jazz, and swing genres, he was a uniquely versatile player, and a musician's musician. He was known to some as the "Miles Davis of bluegrass", and popularized a style called "Hillbilly Jazz". In a career that spanned over six decades, he played with artists as varied as Faron Young, Dicky Betts, Jerry Garcia, The Grateful Dead, The Allman Brothers, Linda Ronstadt, David Grisman, Paul McCartney, and Miles Davis's ex-band members Dave Holland, John Abercrombie and Jimmy Cobb.

Vassar Clements was a Promethean figure on The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band's 1972 album "Will The Circle Be Unbroken". John McEuen of The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band said, "He was the nicest guy. He treated everybody like you were either family or friend. He was the greatest fiddle player in the world, but you never knew it if you talked to him. He influenced the next 30 years of fiddle playing with the ("Circle") album."

Vassar is survived by his daughter, Midge and her husband. His wife, Millie passed away in 1998.

### SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
