December 9 Showcase – Jim Nagle

Jim Nagle has lived around here most of his life, with a side trip to the Florida Institute of Technology after graduating from Herndon High School. As a young biology graduate, he did environmental work, and then switched to DNA sequencing in the 1980s. For the past 17 years he's worked at the National Institutes of Health, including a stint in the lab of Craig Venter of human genome fame.

In his spare time, Jim does athletics, including many Reston Triathlons, Marine Corps Marathons, Boston Marathons, and JFK 50-Mile Races. He was 34th out of 950 in his age group at Marine Corps in October, and just did his 10th JFK two weeks ago. He frequently bike commutes 46 miles round trip to work, and likes motorized bikes, too - he raced motocross in the expert class when younger, and rides BMWs on the road now. His wife Lynn and daughters Antonia and Jacqui keep him busy, too, but he still somehow finds time for another true love, and that's music.

Jim got his first guitar at age ten, about the same time he went to a music-based summer camp, and then took lessons for several years. He's always returned to music, even though events have managed to pull him away occasionally. Jim has explored many guitar styles, both acoustic and electric, including fingerpicking, flatpicking, Grateful Dead-type jamming, and Dobro. Guitar teachers over the years have included Glen Kuykendall of Bluegrass Unlimited Magazine in Warrenton, and Mike Auldridge of the Seldom Scene. His early musical influences run from the Beatles, Beach Boys, Byrds, Rascals, Who, Dead, Little Feat, Stones, and Jethro Tull thru Tim O'Brien and his all-time biggest hero, Dobro star Jerry Douglas.

Dobro and lap-style guitar are particular interests of Jim's, and he'll be playing his Dobro as well as a standard guitar for the showcase. He promises some songs that speak to our times. **Jane Tatum** will join him on stage on guitar and vocals, along with **Donna Xander** on banjo and Dead Man's Hollow bass player **Jared Creason**.

Jim very much appreciates the Folk Club and the opportunities it provides. Come share his love of music!

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified ads, articles, reviews, artwork and other music-related items to newsletter editor Bob Hampton at bhampton@ossva.com. Information should be received 1 week prior to the end of the month for the next month's newsletter. Items will be published on the basis of music-related interest, timeliness, and available space.
