Roger Allen “Tex” Johnson is originally from Haymarket, but has lived in Warrenton for many years. He’s retired from the phone company, and has a son in West Virginia and a daughter in Oregon. He’s an avid whitewater canoe paddler, which rubbed off on his whitewater kayaking son, who even likes to go over large waterfalls.

Tex is planning a cool showcase - **Sherry Stewart** and **Steve Potter** will join him on stage, with a flute and mandolin embellishing the usual guitars. Join them as they say goodbye at the infirmary, then go up country on the L&N to happily dance together under the moonlight in Woodstock. Tex wouldn’t say what the second song was going to be, but that first one sounds like a hit!



In keeping with what is now a tradition for his showcase articles, Tex agreed to spontaneously answer some random questions. We did this interview on a Sunday morning while Meet The Press was airing, which established the dignified tone of the proceedings.

Q: When they make the movie of your life, which actor would you like to see play you, and why?

A: Tom Selleck, because people used to tell me I looked like him when Magnum P. I. was on the air. Of course, I was decades younger and 50 pounds lighter then.

Matt and Shannon Heaton are world-class musicians in the Irish tradition (Irish wood flute/accordion, guitar/bouzouki). John O'Regan from Boston's Irish Music Magazine, wrote, "their duet playing is tight, sweet, and tasteful, lacking nothing on either technical expertise or instrumental virtuosity."

As for their singing, when Matt and Shannon perform centuries-old songs, it feels current & conversational. They make traditional music relevant to American audiences. O'Regan wrote "songwise [there are] hints of an older domestic sound, the familiar downhome

Matt provides a firm foundation on the guitar & bouzouki which is equal parts Richard Thompson and Donal Lunny.
